## Milestones – January'2024

### Services :

1. Following the request from the RI cell(State Health Society, Bihar), two new entry screens, namely District Weekly Review (DWR) and Block Weekly Review (BWR), have been seamlessly incorporated into the existing web portal. These additions have undergone successful pilot testing in 20 districts across Bihar, marking a significant milestone in their implementation.
2. Utilizing the Teacher Transfer Portal in Jharkhand, a total of 263 special cases for transfer requests have been successfully processed. This showcases the efficacy and efficiency of the portal in managing and facilitating the transfer process for teachers in these unique instances.

### Products :

1. After successful field testing and the incorporation of necessary changes, the **BADI** App has been delivered to the ICDS Department for statewide implementation. This marks the completion of the development phase and signifies readiness for the broader utilization of the application across the state.

## Highlights – January'2024

In addition to the aforementioned milestones, the Tech4Gov team has conscientiously dedicated efforts to address the following tasks:

1. **Ms. Nitika** meticulously crafted instructional videos for the "IT Helpdesk," lending her expertise through detailed visual guides. Notably, she provided articulate

voiceovers in both Hindi and English, enhancing the accessibility and inclusivity of the instructional materials.

2. **Mr. Manish** successfully resolved multiple issues related to mapping, including roles, geographic elements, and institutional structures, both at the L1 and L2 levels within the Assam and Bihar PGR System.
3. **PRAGATI 2.0** - Comprehensive documentation has been undertaken to outline the requirements and map the processes essential for the development phase by **Mr. Mayank**. This meticulous documentation serves as a foundation for the systematic and efficient implementation of PRAGATI 2.0.
4. A demonstration was presented to Mr. Anil Mishra from Lucknow, CCC, allowing him to explore the usability of the iLMS for the health sector in Uttar Pradesh. This initiative aims to assess the system's functionality and effectiveness in meeting the specific needs and requirements of UP's health services.
5. The Sukritya dashboard has been expanded to incorporate the latest HWC Assessment data by **Mr. Sourav**. Additionally, rectification of facility assessments has been successfully implemented, including the integration of updated photos for enhanced accuracy and completeness. This extension enhances the functionality and reliability of the **Sukritya dashboard** in capturing and presenting comprehensive data.
6. **Mr. Chandan** played a pivotal role in the post-field testing phase by implementing essential changes based on feedback. His responsibilities encompassed coding, debugging, and enhancing the overall functionality of the BADI App to align with the project's objectives. The collaborative efforts between **Ms. Nitika** and **Mr. Chandan** were instrumental in ensuring the delivery of a high-quality and dependable application for statewide implementation. Their synergy contributed significantly to the success of the project.
7. **Mr. Chitranjan** has successfully crafted a Business Requirements Document (BRD) for the AMRIT System, introducing an additional feature - Feedback Management. This new functionality involves integrating with the Bihar HIMS System, BHAVYA, with the overarching goal of reducing out-of-pocket expenses and enhancing service delivery for beneficiaries. The BRD provides a detailed outline of the specific requirements and objectives, ensuring a clear roadmap for the seamless incorporation of the Feedback Management feature into the AMRIT System.
8. Team was also engaged in the process of developing RFP documentation for the **Bihar Nursing Council Reforms**, the team is actively working on outlining the comprehensive requirements and specifications. This documentation will serve as a formal invitation to potential vendors or service providers to submit proposals for implementing the necessary reforms within the Bihar Nursing Council.
